Eligibility

Must be a one-to-four-unit property owner within CenterPoint Energy's service area.

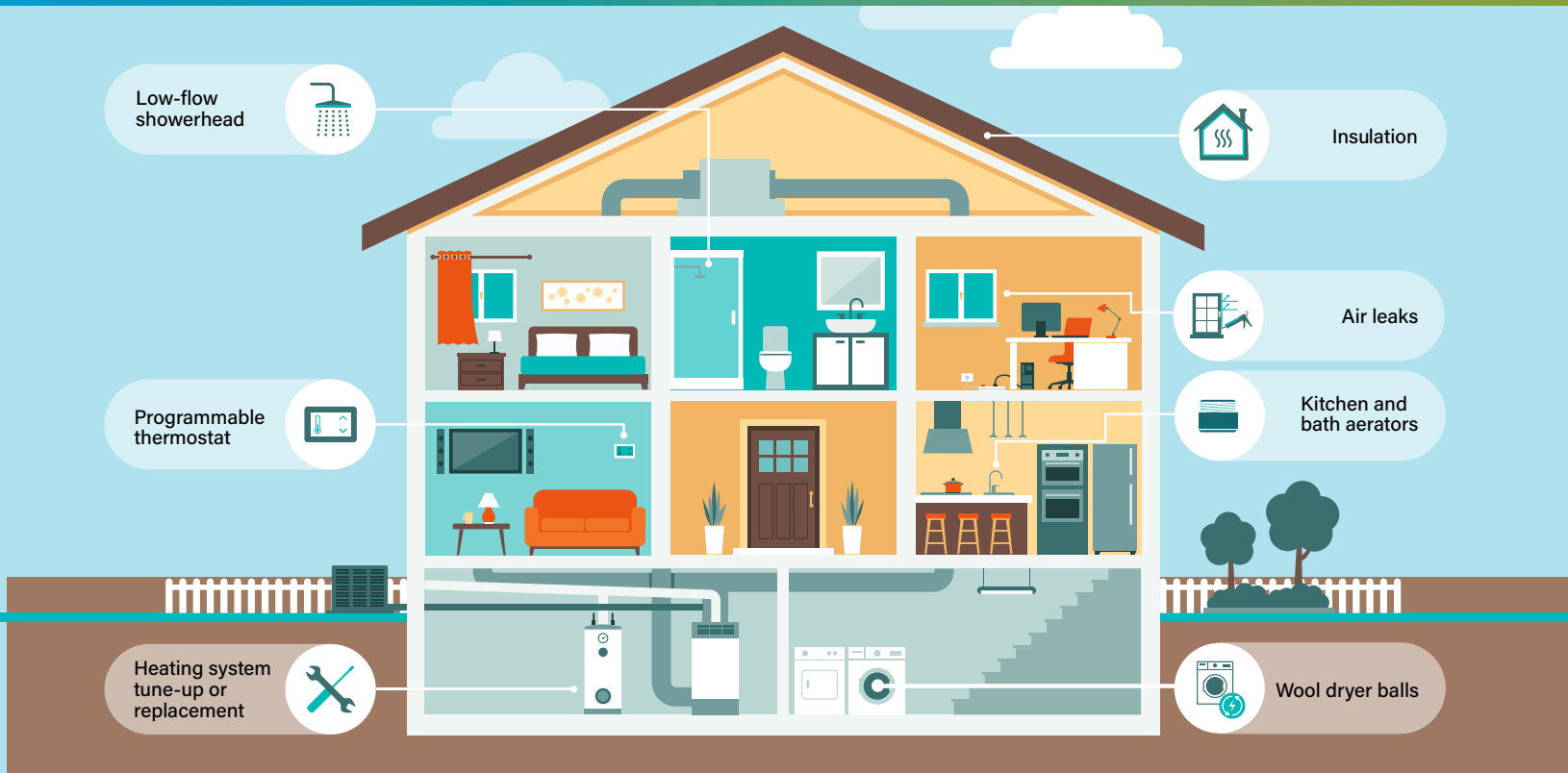
- One-to-four-unit rental properties with at least half the units occupied by income-qualified tenants are eligible to participate.
- Tenant criteria will be verified and have a household income at or below 80% of the area's median income, scaled for household size

At least one of the following documents can be used to verify income eligibility:

- Last three months of pay stubs W-2 form from the most recent tax year
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) recipients: Notice of Decision document
- Women, Infants and Children (WIC) recipients: Participant Summary document
- Medical Assistance: Medical Assistance Health Care Notice
- Social Security: Notice of Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA)
- Habitat for Humanity: A Brush with Kindness homeowner agreement

**Customers may be eligible for additional incentives through their electric provider, city, municipality, state, or through federal tax credits. Eligibility and availability of these incentives can vary based on location and specific project details. Enhanced benefits may apply to CenterPoint customers based on location of residence. Terms and conditions apply.*

This is what an energy-efficient home looks like



Each customer who completes an energy review receives an energy efficiency kit to help them save even more energy. Items in the kit include the following: low-flow showerhead, kitchen and bath aerators, window film, two outlet and switch gaskets, wool dryer balls, rope caulk and water heater temperature gauge.

Simple energy-saving tips and tools can help make a big difference in your home energy use!



Set the thermostat back 7-10°F at night or when away for at least eight hours to help reduce heating costs.



Install foam gaskets behind electrical outlets to seal air leaks.



Stop drafts and air leaks with caulking and weather stripping to keep the home warm in the winter or cool in the summertime.



When washing clothes, switch the temperature setting from hot to warm and always wash with a full load of laundry.
